ECOSOPHY

How to apply ecosophy to practice?

What can I do as an English language teacher in France to help preserve linguistic and cultural diversity?

How can I bring other languages and cultures into my teaching and my management of the University Language Centre?

How can I ensure that students have the opportunity to learn together in holistic and socially responsible ways?

How can I ensure that my instructional design does not have a negative environmental impact? How can I bring the more than human into my practice in a way that is meaningful for me, my colleagues and our students?





Possible solutions

Introduce multilingualism, sustainability and the more than human world through awareness raising content and project-based learning.

For example, writing workshops to create multilingual books with sustainability and nature themes with students and migrant families: bookhoof.org and bhnetwork.hypotheses.org

For example, sustainable campus hunt group activity to get to know each other and the campus (task themes: stop plastic, transport, recycling, garden, student societies)

For example, physical language circuit group projects which connect language learning to place-based learning in a playful way





Possible solutions

Make informed decisions about the use of digital and electronic technology that take into account the environmental impact of producing the equipment and the energy required to use it.

Insist on environmental impact assessment for institutional policy and strategy.

Don't assume that the generalisation of online teaching is inevitable or that it is better for people and for the planet; apply current knowledge to inform decision making.





The Language Centre's Solution

Create a "third space" on campus where:

All languages are valued, they are visible and audible

Linguistic barriers are questioned through translingual practices

Language activities are tangible, manual, physical and creative

Language learning is experientiel, holistic and cooperative

Sustainablity principles are applied to the creation of the space and the activities

Activites and participants are not constrained by the physical limits of the space

The more than human world is present and valued Participants work together to find new sustainable and resilient ways of being in the world







The French government made private English certification a requirement for getting a degree (marketisation of education)
